THE TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JUNE 5, 2016



We are now on the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time and it is so amazing to see how time flies by. By this Sunday, we are almost halfway through the year. But let us always be reminded that time can fly that fast or shall we say “I am not getting any younger”, our journey towards the fulfillment and completion of our salvation continues.

This Sunday we are invited to reflect on God as the author of life. We heard in the first reading (1 Kings 17:17-34) about the raising the dead to life of the widow’s son from Zarephath of Sidon and also in the Gospel (7:11-17) the raising to life of another widow’s son by our Lord Jesus Christ. Both instances of raising the dead to life was done in response to the immediate need of the widows. That is, gaining back the legal jurisdiction of a woman’s life a patriarchal society. Without man/men in their lives, they became irrelevant in such a society. Also, the life transformation of St. Paul in the second reading (Gal 1:11-19), from persecutor of the new Christians to champion of the teaching of Christ to the Jews and the gentiles, is another example of the life changing intervention of

God.

God indeed is so good. He doesn’t want widows to live in an uncertain future. The magnificence of His Divine power is on display by letting people witness the impossible, the raising the dead to life. God actually gives or sustains, not just the life of the sons, but gives them the chance to be relevant in a legal way.

For us in this present time, God in His magnificent power, can always rewrite the path we are walking on. If that path will not be beneficial to us, He can always help us change it. This is how He cares for us. He doesn’t want us to live in an uncertain future but is always carving for us a path towards a concrete and visible one.

The challenge for us then is to be a firm believer! We may or may not witness the raising of the dead to life, but with firm faith in God, who is so good, can always lead us towards a worthy, fruitful and happy life. Just always keep this thought in your heart; **THAT HE IS ALWAYS THERE FOR US!**

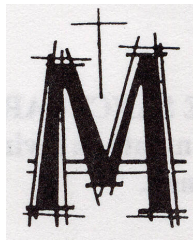

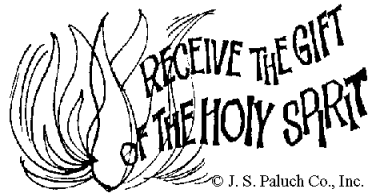

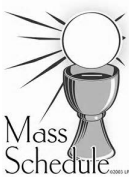

GOING INTO THE HOSPITAL?
THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Prior to entering the hospital for surgery or a procedure for you or a family member, please call the Parish Office requesting the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. It would be appropriate to give this blessing here in the Parish Church before a hospital visit. Frequently, families wait too long until the person is in the hospital and restricted from food consumption. Therefore, they're unable to receive Holy Viaticum. Make sure the hospital knows you are a Catholic and that the Hospital Chaplain has been invited to visit.
