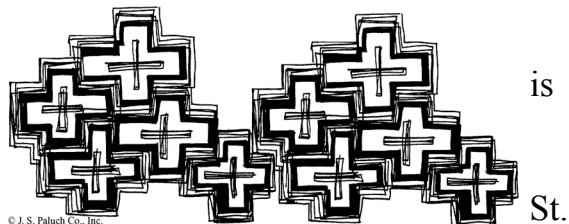

# THE FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

JULY 3, 2016

“Before Pilate, Christ proclaims that he ‘has come into the world, to bear witness to the truth.’ The Christian not to ‘be ashamed then of testifying to our Lord.’ In situations that require witness to the faith, the Christian must profess it without equivocation, after the example of Paul before his judges. We must keep ‘a clear conscience toward God and toward men.’” (CCC2471)

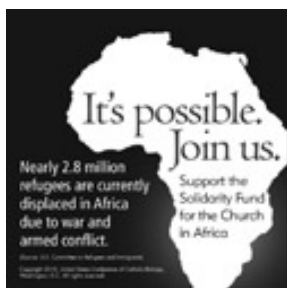

Perhaps we might put the readings together in this way: The Lord sends us forth as His witnesses, as His disciples. Our primary purpose is to tell the world of His Good News, beginning in our families and in our communities. The Good News is that we are accepted by God, that God has mercy on us, that He forgives and reconciles us by His Son Jesus.

In our proclamation, we are not to live as others in the world, because as St. Augustine said that we are in the world but we are not of the world. Our lives, therefore, must not be worldly or encumbered by trappings which take us away from our primary purpose. Our Christian lives will be a share in the cross of Christ, which means that there will be struggles sometimes hardship and suffering. But in everything, because the news is “good,” we will be a people of great joy.
